CATHOLIC STUDENTS

There is no tuition for registered, active stewardship parish families. Because we are committed to the Stewardship Way of Life, Holy Name Parish makes Catholic education available to active parish stewards without charging tuition.

NON-CATHOLIC STUDENTS

PRE-KINDERGARTEN:

4 year old Pre-Kindergarten students attend Monday through Thursday. Tuition is \$125.00 per month, for nine months.

KINDERGARTEN THROUGH 6th GRADE:

Holy Name Catholic School tuition rates are broken into child and family rates, and are based upon monthly payments for ten months.

MONTHLY TUITION RATES:

TECHNOLOGY

Holy Name students have access to a wide variety of technology tools used to engage students in deeper learning and connect families to the classroom. Holy Name students have access to learning systems at school, and optionally at home. Parents have access to an online grading system as well as access to the digital learning systems to help motivate and guide their children.
